## Juniors start their Wimbledon campaigns

Junior Roland Garros Champions Kristina Mladenovic (FRA) and Daniel Berta (SWE) lead strong fields going into the 2009 Junior Championships at Wimbledon.

Mladenovic heads to the All England Club having won the Grade 1 warm-up event in Roehampton and is the clear favourite to add another Grand Slam title. But reigning champion Laura Robson (GBR), who took Daniela Hantuchova to three sets in the women's main draw, will not give up her crown without a fight and is one of several players looking to disrupt the French world No.1's plans.

Roehampton runner-up Olivia Rogowska (AUS) also looks at home on the grass and has a WTA ranking of 260. Ana Bogdan (ROU) reached the semifinals at the Australian Open this year but has won just one match on grass during her otherwise illustrious junior career. ITF Junior World Champion Noppawan Lertcheewakarn (THA) will also be a threat, having reached the final in 2008 and the semifinals of Roehampton. Other leading contenders in the girls' event are Italian Open champion Sloane Stephens (USA) and Timea Babos (HUN).

Boys' world No.3 Berta had a successful campaign in Asia prior to his victory at Roland Garros, but has been inconsistent this year and is an unknown quantity on grass. Second seed Liang-Chi Huang (TPE) lost his opening match on Saturday to Ashley Hewitt (GBR) in the first day's biggest upset.

Bernard Tomic (AUS) won the junior Australian Open and reached the semifinals at Wimbledon in 2008. He has played sparingly in juniors this year, but his ATP ranking of 358 makes him a contender. Argentines Agustin Velotti and Facundo Arguello have both tasted significant success this year and will believe they have the game to claim the title. Other pretenders to the boys' crown are Roland Garros finalist Gianni Mina (FRA), Casablanca Cup champion Julien Uriguen (GUA) and Roehampton champion Devin Britton (USA).

## Women ready for Wimbledon wheelchair event

The Wimbledon wheelchair doubles event gets underway on Friday and features a women's event for the first time.

Action starts with the women's semifinals, where Dutch top seeds Korie Homan and Esther Vergeer begin their bid to add to their 2009 Australian Open and Roland Garros titles against Germany's Katharina Kruger and Sharon Walraven of the Netherlands. Florence Gravelier and Jiske Griffioen are No. 2 seeds despite failing to reach the finals in Melbourne and Paris, and the French-Dutch duo face Britain's Lucy Shuker and Australian Daniela di Toro.

While the women's gold and silver medallists from the 2008 Paralympics are playing with different doubles partners at Wimbledon, the men's event opens on Saturday with a straight rematch of the men's doubles final in Beijing. French top seeds and Roland Garros champions Stephane Houdet and Michael Jeremiasz meet Sweden's Camozzi Doubles Masters champions Stefan Olsson and Peter Wikstrom. The other semifinal features Dutch second seeds Maikel Scheffers and Ronald Vink against Shingo Kunieda (JPN) and Robin Ammerlaan (NED). Both the men's and women's finals will be played on Sunday.



## Wimbledon Junior Educational Forum

Top juniors from around the world attended a forum in London last Thursday as part of the ITF Junior Tennis School, which aims to educate junior players on all aspects of tennis, from player welfare to tennis betting and commercial aspects of the game.

Luca Santilli, the ITF's Manager of Juniors and Seniors Tennis, welcomed the players, parents and coaches to the Wimbledon Junior Educational Forum 2009 and this was followed by a presentation from Dr Stuart Miller, ITF Head of Science and Technical, an expert in the field of anti-doping. Sandra Harwitt from the International Tennis Writers Association spoke about working with the media and participants watched a recorded DVD message from 14-time Grand Slam champion Roger Federer, who shared his experiences of the media and its role in promoting tennis worldwide.

There was also a talk by Kathy Martin, ITF Player Welfare Officer, who gave the players invaluable information regarding child welfare and the steps being taken to ensure their safety. To round off an informative evening, Jeff Rees, Director of the Tennis Integrity Unit, talked to the players about the dangers of tennis betting.

Everyone involved with the event agreed that the evening was a success, and a good way of working together with coaches to educate players and prepare them for their future. The forum was one of several that the ITF is running this year in conjunction with its regional associations around the world, and between 600 and 800 junior players will take part. ## ITF 14 & Under Teams begin tour in Paris

On Friday, 39 players from 25 countries will begin a five-week European tour as part of four ITF 14 & Under Touring Teams: ITF/Tennis Europe East European Team, ITF/COSAT South American Team, ITF/ATF Asian Team and ITF/CAT African & Rest of World Team. The four teams were selected based on their performances at regional qualifying competitions throughout the year.

The teams are financed by the Grand Slam Development Fund (GSDF), which provides players with the opportunity to take part in top-level international competition and invaluable experience of travelling abroad as part of a team under the guidance of nine ITF coaches. The tour consists of five weeks of category 1 and 2 European tournaments as listed below:

Prior to the tour, a three-day training camp is organised in Paris, allowing the ITF players and coaches to get to know each other and practice on clay prior to the first tournament.

Frank Couraud, ITF Development Projects Administrator, who supervises the ITF touring teams and who will attend the first tournament, said: "For over 15 years, promising young players from developing tennis nations have had the chance to compete with the best players of the same age from developed countries. Many of the professional players in fact played on this tour at the start of their careers. If you want to see the players of the future, this tour is the ideal place."
