Minutes of meeting held on 24th March, 2022 chaired by Secretary (Sports) to consider the proposal of ACTC for the discipline of Tennis for the year 2022-23.

A meeting to finalize the Annual Calendar for Training and Competition for the discipline of Tennis for the year 2022-23 was held on 24th March 2022 under the chairpersonship of Smt. Sujata Chaturvedi, Secretary (Sports) MYAS at the Conference Hall, Sports Authority of India HQ, New Delhi. The list of participants is at annexure I.

2. At the outset, Secretary General, AITA listed the projected targets for Tennis including Asian Games, 2022, and submitted the following measurable outcomes:

3. AITA presented the plans for the National Coaching Camps and Foreign Exposures for events leading to Asian Games, 2022 in September. The budget summary was presented thereafter in accordance with the latest norms for funding under Assistance to NSF Scheme.

4. Secretary General, AITA made following commitments, which were included as binding decisions as part of approved ACTC calendar and budget:

4.1 Gender Budgeting to be done so as to ensure equal expenditure for Men and Women.

- 4.2 Strengthening and capacity building in National Camps through inclusion of Sports Science Staff and ensuring scientific evaluation of campers and targeted interventions thereof. Data management of the performance evaluations be ensured.
- 4.3 Maintaining a proper system of utilisation of Government grants under the scheme.
- 4.4 Displaying of grants received through the scheme on website of AITA.
- 4.5 Strict compliance of WADA Code and NADA rules, details of educational plans for athletes and display of Anti-Doping awareness programmes on their respective websites.

5. The calendar and budget were considered and approved with modifications pursuant to deliberations. The total budget of ACTC was approved for AITA up to March, 2023 with a cap of **Rs. 5.50 Cr.**, of this, 10% is earmarked for contingencies and 3% for administrative expenses of the NSF as per the latest norms of MYAS dated 28th February 2022. It is emphasized that NSF will allocate adequate budget as demanded for Asian Games, 2022 and ensure that all the needs of athletes as projected under ACTC is fulfilled.

6. The budget is approved for the following requirements:

6.1 National Coaching Camp (Junior)

A limit of maximum of 90 camp days and 60 camp days in a year for Seniors and Juniors age group respectively shall be adhered to. *Placed at Annexure – II.*

6.2 International Competition (Senior & Junior)

Foreign Exposure in all age groups and across all events should be with a focused approach on targeted events where there are realistic medal chances and with commensurate exposures to the Junior Group. Further, limit of 90 days in a year for training and competition abroad has to be adhered to. *Placed at Annexure – III (Senior) & IV (Junior).*

6.3 International Competition in India (Senior & Junior)

Placed at Annexure – V (Senior) & VI (Junior).

6.4 Domestic Competitions

Placed at Annexure – VII.

6.5 Remuneration - Indian Coaches

The names and salaries of the coaches and support staff to be empanelled for the National Coaching Camp shall be approved separately by the Empanelment Committee by 30.04.2022. *Placed at Annexure – VIII.*

6.6 Equipment (Consumables & Non-Consumables)

The NSF to procure equipment as per circular of MYAS. Placed at Annexure - IX.

7. The proposed ACTC is approved within the approved budgetary ceiling as stated at Para 5. A review would be undertaken after Asian Games 2022, in the month of October 2022, based on the achievements in the Asian Games, 2022, for any additional requirement of funds subject to availability of budget under the 'Assistance to NSF' Scheme.
8. Modifications to the calendar can be made by NSF with the approval by DG SAI within the overall approved budget. It was reiterated that all the guidelines mentioned in MYAS circular dated 28th Feb, 2022 will be adhered to.
9. Secretary (Sports) emphasised on the following aspects:
- a. NSF should closely monitor Asian Games preparation and ensure that all needs of the medal probable athletes are fulfilled.
 - b. Alternate training and competition plans should be prepared to cater for any possible further outbreaks of COVID 19. Also, strict protocols should be put in place to avoid COVID 19 infections during training.
 - c. AITA should also identify Tennis Centers to nurture grassroots talent & broad base the sport in collaboration with SAI.
 - d. AITA should finalize their selection policy, which would be notified on their website.
 - e. Department of sports would grant necessary sanction for Coach, Referee & Judge development under HRDS. AITA would submit a comprehensive proposal to Director (Sports).
10. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
